Millennium Sign Restored

The Millennium sign on Moor Lane North, originally installed to commemorate the year 2000, was funded by the generous contributions of Ravenfield residents and local businesses.

Over time, the sign has started to show signs of weathering. Earlier this year, it was carefully restored to its original condition and now shines as brightly as it did when first unveiled.



Electric Lights Replace Solar Lights on Popular Footpath

In 2019, Ravenfield Parish Council secured funding from our Ward Councillor to install solar lights along the footpath connecting Woodlaithes village to Hollings Lane.

This well-used path had formed naturally as pedestrians began taking this route, leading to multiple requests for lighting in the area.

Initially, we explored the possibility of installing electric lights, but the costs were too expensive, especially since the footpath had not yet been adopted by the Borough Council. As a more feasible alternative, solar lights were installed.



The solar lights served the community well until recently, when some began to fail. The growth of the tree canopies also contributed to the issue, as they started blocking sunlight, preventing the solar lights from fully recharging.

In 2021, we were again successful in obtaining funding from our Ward Councillors to help cover the costs of installing a tarmac footpath. Upon completion, the Borough Council agreed to adopt this footpath. At the same time, trunking was installed to accommodate an electric feed for future lighting.

Given the challenges with the solar lights, our Ward Councillors collaborated with the Borough Council to secure funding for the installation of electric street lights. These new lights have been a welcome improvement, providing consistent and reliable lighting for everyone using the footpath.

We're pleased to see how well these new electric lights have been received by the community, and we appreciate the continued support from our Ward Councillors in making this project a success.


Hollings Lane Play Area Renovations Scheduled for September 2024





Meet Your Parish Councillors

Ravenfield Parish Council is composed of seven dedicated volunteer Councillors who work to serve our community.

Following the Parish Council elections in May 2024, Councillor Callear, Councillor Jay, Councillor Jones, Councillor Jupp, Councillor Lilley, and Councillor Rowley were all elected to represent Ravenfield Parish. In July 2024, we were pleased to welcome Councillor Whitworth, who joined the Council through co-option.

Neil Pearson and Toni Leach chose to step down as Parish Councillors. However, they continue to actively volunteer and support community activities, for which we are very grateful.

Parish Councillors are usually elected every four years, with the next elections anticipated in May 2028.



Ravenfield Parish Council Chair's Report 2023/24

I took over the Chairman's role in May last year. Thanks to Councillor Rebecca Jupp for her year as Chair. We welcomed new Councillor. Maria Jones to the Parish Council. My thanks also to Councillor Toni Leach who is sadly leaving us for personal reasons. She will be missed.

The Parish Council has worked hard all year for the benefit of our village and its residents. We have supported the community litter picks, crossroads gardening, the hanging flower baskets and the poppies on lampposts. We have pressed for permanent lighting on the path in the wood between Woodlaithes and Hollings Lane which is now installed. Our thanks to our Ward Councillors for helping with the funding of them.

Ravenfield Rangers Junior Football Club continue to use the pitch on Hollings Lane and we support their activities.

The Parish Hall is still very well used by many groups throughout the week and weekends. We have had to spend money on the Hall to keep in line with safety updates so we are compliant with fire and electrical regulations. The Hall has been redecorated along with new curtains and notice boards. The Hall is available to hire for groups and also private parties. Contact our Clerk for details.

We have installed a new notice board and resident donated funds for a new seat at the junction of Braithwell Road and Radford Close, which is being well used. At the crossroads old planting has been removed and a complete redesign has been done with a resin path and new seat. Outside the shops have been included in the design with a new path and seating. Anti parking posts have been fitted to stop vehicles mounting the kerb and parking on the grass verge. The millennium sign is due to be refurbished for the first time since its installation.

The Redrow development is progressing and we have had some complaints which we have taken to the builders to address. We continue to keep an eye on the build.

In June we are hoping to mark D Day 80 by putting up flags alongside the hanging baskets.

Going forward our main projects into this year and next will be to look at updating the play area on Hollings Lane, possibly a redesign depending on costs.

We would still like a perimeter path around Jubilee field so it can be accessed and used more, especially in the winter months. As we all know drainage of the field is a huge problem as its water logged much of the year.

The Council will again be funding the Christmas lights which are popular with everyone. Also, we are going ahead with our third Christmas panto in the Hall for the children and their families.

Finances. Reluctantly and after lengthy discussions we have increased the precept by 6%. Costs are constantly on the increase and to keep our Parish Hall and projects on track we had little choice. We are still one of the cheapest in the borough. We are in a healthy position and we want to keep it that way.

A big thank you to Gemma our Clerk and RFO for looking after the accounts and keeping us Councillors grounded. Can I also mention Sarah Walker our Caretaker who does a lot of work looking after the Hall for us.

If I may just say as I step down as Chairman for the third time, and take my leave as a Parish Councillor of twelve years, it has been a rewarding experience. I have learnt a lot about how Councils work. To me some Councils seem better than others and this Council is one of the better ones in my opinion. Perhaps I'm biased. We aren't paid in any way for this role, we volunteer our time to attend many meetings and hands on community work. We have a great set of Councillors to take us forward with new people stepping in with new ideas and skills. Once again thank you to all my colleagues for their support and hard work over the last year. Maria, I wish you well as incoming Chair.

The sponsorship of the poppies is £5.00 (minimum) each and all of donations received are passed onto the Royal British Legion Poppy Appeal.



Ravenfield Park Management

An interesting summer in Ravenfield Park with fishing taking centre stage with excellent catches from all the ponds.

Our membership has seen an increase due to changing the membership system. Anglers can now join at any time of year and receive a full annual digital membership from the time of joining. We no longer issue membership cards, replacing them with 21st century digital identification permits.

These have been received very positively from our existing customers and new members have been able to fish immediately.

We have had a greater uptake of juvenile and youngsters joining which can only be a good sign- keeping them away from phones and computer games will allow them to understand the countryside around them.

We have taken the opportunity to encourage a dads and lads and daughters to take part and send in photographs.

Our annual match of traditional anglers versus our match men took place during the summer.

Despite a valiant effort by the traditional anglers - using tackle from yesteryear - the match men were victorious with local legend Lenny Rimminton wining with 38lb of bream.

A point of note must be the state of the sewage treatment works at Old Ravenfield.

The regular output of untreated sewage became a real problem for us in the park. A pipe that took, what we believed to be clean water was actually untreated sewage and this had a significant impact upon our Crucian carp stock pond.

Three years ago - untreated sewage decimated our stock of red listed A1 Crucian carp from our stock pond.

Our response was to divert the water away from the stock pond into our Kingfisher Pond and into a stream that fed Hooten Brook.

This brook went via our Bridge Pond.

The result was significant- our stock pond was almost completely restored. We have now seen a vast amount of Crucian Carp bred in the last 18 months that confirms our belief that it was the best decision we made.

Anglers can join Ravenfield Ponds but selecting a membership and joining online.

Going into winter the park will be in good shape. Keith Rhodes out longstanding park warden will continue to





Ravenfield Art Group

Ravenfield Art group has had another successful year. Several new members have joined us, and we now have members of all ages from one still at school to those in their eighties. There is still a short waiting list as we are limited by table space.

The annual art exhibition was again a most enjoyable community event benefitting three different community groups. There were 232 works of art on display as well as works by a ceramicist and a fused glass artist. Both St. James' Church and the Ravenfield Community Plan Group, supplied refreshments over the two-day event and made a healthy profit each for their funds. Visitors were also entertained by live music on saxophone and keyboard by two of our supporters.

We have changed the date of our 2024 exhibition to fit in with an event by a local football team and hope that our new date of 25/26 May will be a successful as previous events.



Ravenfield Ladies Friendship Circle (Ravenfield LFC)

Following the closure of Ravenfield WI this year, Ravenfield LFC was formed in May 2024. The group already has over 20 members, most of whom live in Ravenfield. Our meetings are very informal and varied, ranging from talks and activities to social evenings and trips out.




