#### **Whitestone Solar Farm**

At the end of 2024 some residents from Firsby attended the monthly Parish Council meeting to inform us about an enormous solar farm being proposed for South Yorkshire. They were the first to learn about it because their houses would be impacted by a large solar farm on Conisbrough Park. During the following months the Parish Council and other interested parties were invited to several events giving details of the scheme.

It is called Whitestone Solar Farm run by a firm called Green Nation. The reason this area was chosen is that there is a large substation at Brinsworth linking to the National Grid. It was originally there because of the steel industry in Rotherham/Sheffield.

The areas affected are Conisbrough, Wickersley, Thurcroft, Swallownest, Treeton, Kiveton Park and Harthill. It will be on land close to the M18 and M1 South corridor. Obviously other adjoining communities such as Firsby will also be affected. Land up to 3,500 acres will be needed.

Solar farms with a capacity less than 50 MW are decided for planning purposes by the Local Authority. The Whitestone development will be 750 MW! Because of this, the permission or otherwise will be given by the Secretary of State.

Rotherham MBC will be consultees but not make the decision. We are not aware of a solar farm this large anywhere else in England.





An original submission has been put before the Planning Inspectorate. Many points were raised which the developers must address. One of these was the need to include cable channels in the next submission. There will be no pylons in the scheme but in addition to panels there will be underground cables, inverters, battery energy storage systems, substations and a main project substation.

The timetable at the moment is there should be a second consultation during autumn 2025, a submission for a Development Consent Order during spring 2026 and a decision by the Secretary of State in the summer of 2027. If approved, construction would start in 2027.

### **Community Governance Review**

In 2019 the Parish Council submitted a legitimate Community Governance Review (CGR) to Rotherham MBC asking them to move the boundary between Ravenfield and Bramley to reflect the changes made in the Rotherham Local Plan. It was rejected primarily because Bramley objected and there were no residents on the new estate (then named Poppy Fields by the builders) to give their views.

We can now resubmit the CGR. Thanks to those of you who have already signed our petition. The next step is to consult with our new neighbours on the affected area and hopefully gather their support.

The decision has financial implications because currently Bramley receive the precept and Community Infrastructure Levy for the newly built properties.

We have a strong case and hopefully this time RMBC will come to the right decision.

### Jubilee Field All Weather Trail

You may remember our article last year asking for your help in completing a survey to share your thoughts and opinions on the proposed project for an all-weather trail at Jubilee Field.

The plan involves creating a tarmac footpath around the perimeter of the field, wild planting and the development of natural habitats for local wildlife. This path would offer a clean, accessible walking route with safer footing for all users, while allowing people to enjoy the field's natural beauty all year round.

The response to the survey was excellent, and we are extremely grateful to everyone who took part. The overwhelming majority were in favour of the proposed design.

With the community's support confirmed, we began preparing the project plan and seeking contractor tenders.

Unfortunately, when the tenders came in, they were significantly higher than anticipated, each exceeding £130,000, due largely to ongoing inflation in construction costs. This created a problem, as our funding plan relied on securing a grant, which is capped at £100,000 (with the Council required to contribute 10.75% of the total cost). The increased prices not only meant a shortfall in grant funding but also placed an additional financial cost on the Council.

We have since reviewed the design with contractors to explore ways of reducing costs. The tarmac footpath is the main expense. While we considered alternative materials such as compacted gravel or hex pave, these offered only small savings, had a shorter lifespan, and did not provide a consistently clean, safe walking surface (an essential aim of the project). As many of you know, Jubilee Field can become extremely muddy in the wet winter months due to its clay base, making a durable, weatherproof surface and improved drainage essential.

At present, the Council cannot cover the potential £50,000 plus funding gap, so the project is on hold until additional funding is secured. One possible avenue is linked to the Community Governance Review (see the article on our front page). If successful, Community Infrastructure Levy funds from any remaining properties built on the Redrow development could be used to help finance the project.

It is disappointing not to be able to deliver this project just yet, but we remain determined to make it happen. We will continue to keep you informed through the News page of our website, our Facebook page, and the Parish noticeboards.

## Hollings Lane Play Area Renovations

Last September, improvement works were carried out at the Hollings Lane play area. The old floor surface was

replaced with new wet-pour safety surfacing, and various repairs were made to the play equipment, including the replacement of worn parts.

One of the baby swings was replaced with a standard swing to give older children more opportunity to enjoy the swings. The original basket swing remains in place and continues to be suitable for all ages, from 2 to 11 years old. The perimeter fencing was also refreshed with a new coat of paint. Special thanks go to the Community Payback team for their hard work in making this possible.

We would also like to extend our gratitude to the Ravenfield Youth Charity for covering all associated costs for these improvements.





### Save our Green Belt Conisbrough Parks

We're a group of people, residents from the local area, who want to stop Whitestone 1, the proposed Solar Farm on Conisbrough Parks. This huge site of over 400,000 solar panels will have a big impact on the Greenbelt and the surrounding villages of Conisbrough, Clifton, Micklebring, Firsby and Ravenfield.

We've focused on Whitestone 1 but have engaged with Whitestone 2 and 3, discussing issues with their representatives on Parish Councils and local groups.

If Whitestone 1 is successful, our way of life will change. We'll lose beautiful vistas and outlooks, be restricted where we can walk, and our roads will be compromised for the next few years. We'll have diversions, heavy goods vehicles, and a vast sea of black glass and large noisy battery storage. Public footpaths and bridal ways will be closed while the work is going on - up to two years.





We've been working hard to stop Whitestone 1. We challenged Green Nation, the company behind the development, and they held an extra consultation event in Conisbrough because of our persistence and pressure. We've also contacted key players and influencers, which brought this solar development onto the table of MPs John Healey, Jake Richards and Sally Jameson. We'll continue to lobby on your behalf.

We've met with elected members from Doncaster and Rotherham, as well as key planning department officers.

Ve're closely monitoring local solar farm applications since Whitestone arrived, as other developments have joined the frenzy, potentially causing significant sprawl across our countryside.

We've raised funds and engaged with the community through coffee mornings, drop-ins, and social nights. Our first public meeting on 14th April saw 350 attendees, and we hope to repeat that on 8th September at 7.00pm at the Ivanhoe Centre, Conisbrough, where we'll share updates on our current work.

The funds raised are being used to engage experts. We've recently engaged an Environmental Barrister to ensure we're on the right track. We have regular committee meetings supported by subgroups in Fundraising, Wildlife and Fauna, Strategy and Policy. If you can help or offer specialised expertise, please contact:

### Ravenfield's Landscape Under Threat United Opposition to Whitestone Industrial Solar Proposal



Nestled amidst rolling fields, the tranquil beauty of Ravenfield and the historic charm of Firsby are cherished by many, from the glassy waters of Ravenfield Ponds and Firsby Reservoir to views stretching out over the historic Conisbrough Castle. This landscape not only provides a haven for wildlife and leisure but also secures our food supply, with the current harvest in full swing, a testament to the land's productivity.

Residents in Ravenfield have expressed concerns about the potential impact of Whitestone One on the local landscape. The proposed project is expected to be large in scale, with extended construction periods and underground cabling to Brinsworth. Residents have raised several issues for consideration:

 Environmental and food security: Productive farmland may be lost, which could affect food production during a time of global uncertainty.

- Supply chain practices: There are questions regarding labour conditions involved in supply chains, particularly in relation to manufacturing overseas.
- Property values: Evidence suggest that properties neighbouring to solar developments experience loss in value.
- Carbon footprint: While responding to climate considerations, some residents note the carbon costs associated with the manufacturing process where burning coal is required in the manufacture of the panels.
- No Local benefit: The development is planned to be owned by private investment companies, raising questions about potential impacts on local employment and energy pricing.

Despite these and many other concerns including health concerns, many residents in Ravenfield and Firsby were overlooked in the initial consultations with no meeting held within Ravenfield. Residents strongly

feel that this proposal is not about providing "clean" energy to the grid but is for profit of investors over of a 60 year period.

This is not the only threat, a second proposal is also planned for Firsby Lane by a German company called llos who will also be taking land.

#### **Ravenfield Parish Council Chair's Report 2024/25**

This has been my first year as Chair. I took over from Councillor Neil Pearson and would like to thank him and the other members of the Council for their ongoing help and support. I would also like to welcome new Councillor Lilley and Councillor Whitworth.

The Parish Council has worked hard all year for the benefit of our village and its residents. We have supported the community litter picks, the hanging flower baskets and the poppies on lampposts. This raised a total of amount of £130.00 in donations for the British Legion.

Ravenfield Rangers Junior Football Club continue to use the pitch on Hollings Lane, and we support their activities.

The Parish Hall is still very well used by many groups throughout the week and weekends. We continue to keep up with the maintenance of this to ensure this is a safe and pleasant environment for everyone who frequents it. The hall is available to hire for groups and private parties. Should you wish to make enquiries please direct these to our Clerk, Gemma.

The Redrow development is progressing, and we continue to receive complaints, so our work continues raising these with the builders to try to bring about a resolution to issues raised. We will continue to deal with these going forward.

We have updated the Hollings Lane play area, which included a refit of a new surface area, repair to the perimeter fencing, repaint and repaired and replaced items of play equipment which included removal of one of the smaller swings for a swing suitable for older children.

We would still like an All-Weather-Trail around Jubilee field so it can be accessed and used more, especially in the winter months. The main challenge for us is that the drainage of the field is a huge problem as it is waterlogged for much of the year. We have managed to move forward with this project in obtaining a plan, carrying out a consultation with residents and obtaining quotes. We continue with our efforts regarding this project.

The Council continue to fund the Christmas Lights which are popular. On 3 December 2024 at the Christmas Light switch on, Bramley Brass Band played whilst Ravenfield Primary Academy sang Christmas Carols. We are continuing with this and wanted to make this earlier this year with Christmas Light switch on being Friday 21st November 2025.

We also had our third Christmas panto, Beauty and the Beast, on 14 December 2024 which was a huge success. Within a few days of the tickets being available the 90 spaces were sold out. As it has proved so successful, we will continue to organise a Christmas panto in December.

A Remembrance Service was held on Moor Lane North, on 10 November 2022 and this was very well attended. Refreshments were provided in the Ravenfield Parish Hall following this service and this was also very well attended. We will continue with this service and to follow on with refreshments at the Parish Hall.

The Millennium Sign on Moor Lane North, was originally installed to commemorate the year 2000, was funded by contributions from the residents of Ravenfield and local businesses. Due to signs of weathering this was restored to its original condition.

Finances, reluctantly and after lengthy discussions we have increased the precept by 4.5%. This is because costs are constantly increasing and to keep the Parish Hall and projects on track, we have had no alternative but to take such measures to try to maintain a healthy budget.

We have also developed a brand-new website, and a great deal of work has gone into uploading all the information. This new website is user-friendly and simpler for residents to quickly find information. The website also provides useful information in relation to community groups that most residents may find useful.

Whilst we continue to use Parish Council noticeboards to make announcements, we also have our Facebook page which is regularly updated with useful information for residents. This has been a vital move forward in communication and the results of this can be seen from the ticket sales with the Christmas Pantomime being sold out in a few days.

I would like to say, a big thank you to Gemma our Clerk for the work she does in keeping the Councillors organised. Also, a mention to Sarah, the Caretaker for the work she does in looking after the hall.

As I step down as Chair, I would like to thank everyone for the support and guidance provided during my time as Chair. I hand you over to Dave, who will be the incoming Chair.



The anglers broke for lunch and enjoyed a sandwich and pastries before settling down for the second half of the day. In the end the Matchmen snook a win by 4lb2oz!





If you think you are eligible please feel free to contact the charity.



# Bramley Townswomen's Craft Group (July 2025)

Sadly, we have been informed by Head Quarters that Townswomen (T.G) is to close in January 2026. The Trustees have worked hard to try to avoid this but due to declining membership and therefore finances, it has become impossible to carry on as there is rent to pay for HQ premises, salaries and insurances operating from the Birmingham.

Townswomen Guilds were formed from the suffragette movement and in 2029 would have celebrated 100 years. Their aim was to empower women and girls to fight for a better life through education and for many to eventually take a seat in national government.

The Rotherham District Federation of which Bramley is a member have held meetings to ask the opinion of its members as to how they would like to proceed, if at all, and decisions have been made by the Guilds to carry on. We will continue to hold and meet bi-monthly with other Guilds in the Federation. We have also agreed to carry on with our usual activities such as outings, book club, theatre group, lunch gatherings and the usual carol service Christmas celebrations, and other important annual dates.

This brings me to the twice monthly Craft group which is held in Ravenfield Parish Hall. You do not have had to be a Townswoman to attend. We do not pay an annual subscription. We pay £1 entrance fee; this covers the hire of the Hall for our sessions and light refreshments. Many of us knit for the Rotherham Women's Refuge, mostly children's garments and the neo-natal ward at Rotherham Hospital.

There are ladies doing other crafts who are willing to share their knowledge with others. You may enjoy a craft of your own that you can share with others.

Our group numbers are around 20, wo enjoy each other's company, exchange ideas and are very friendly. Anyone is welcome.

Why not come along, the first and third Thursday of each month 1:30pm - 3:30pm. Meet new friends and maybe learn a new skill.

We hope to see new faces at Ravenfield Parish Hall.


