


#### **Book Swap News**

# Ravenfield Parish Council Chair's Report 2019/20

This was my second year as Chairman. Usually the role at Ravenfield is rotated on an annual basis, but due to the pandemic and the postponement of the local elections last year, I remained in the position for a further year. The chairman for 2021-22 is Councillor Rowley and I wish him every success in the role.

During the year Councillor Jesson and Councillor Finch stepped down from their roles and on behalf of the Parish Council I would like to thank them both for their time, commitment and the energy they have provided. We have welcomed two new councillors to the Parish Council, Councillor O'Nion and Councillor Leach.

I would like to thank the members of the Parish Council for the continued help and support they provide to both the Parish Council and local community. I would also like to thank our Clerk Gemma O'Carroll and caretaker Sarah for their ongoing help and support .



The local elections in May 2021 saw Parish Councillors elected and a change to our local ward area and Ward Councillors who represent our community at Rotherham Borough Council.

I don't think any of us imagined the scale and impact this past year would

have on the world and on our everyday lives. I want to take a moment to pay tribute to those who have died; our thoughts are with those who have lost loved ones. I also want to use this

opportunity to give thanks to our amazing key workers, businesses and volunteers who have rallied round and supported our community. We are so grateful for everything you have done and continue to do.



New lighting and a hard footpath laid in the woods between Hollings Lane and Woodlaithes has improved access and been well received. At the request of parishioners, we sited a war memorial stone near the millennium stone on Moor Lane North. A blessing and services have taken place there since its unveiling.

This year the Parish Council agreed to make no increase in the precept for 2021/22 paid via your council tax. Despite no regular income from the hall last year, the precept and grants we have received have kept the finances stable. The Parish Hall extension was completed over the summer in 2020. There is now storage space for groups using the hall, a small meeting room, and a book swap library. The hall has been painted and has new furniture as part of the makeover inside, and is open, and ready to welcome back users and groups.

The Parish Council has again organised hanging baskets in the village, and arranged for Christmas lights at the shops and the trees at the Cavalier. We booked Maltby Miners Brass band (see photo), to play at various locations around the village in the lead up to Christmas 2020.



We continue to work with public bodies to address ongoing matters of concern to residents including parking and crime issues, as well as off-road vehicles ridden illegally through local woods and countryside. There have been several speed-watch visits by South Yorkshire Police to record traffic speeding through the village. Open spaces around Ravenfield for which we have responsibility, such as Hollings Lane Field and the Jubilee Field have had regular routine maintenance throughout the year. Plans to conduct drainage repairs on the Jubilee Field are in place, but the date is still to be confirmed.

The opportunity to re-open the allotment area in the village received a very positive response from the community and the Parish Council is currently developing this project to enable it to go ahead.

#### News from St James's Church 2020/2021

The past year, as we all know, has been so different for everyone and particularly for our church. It has been a testing time, especially mentally, for some of our Church family.

Following the government and diocese instructions for Covid 19, our church has gone from closure, to being open for private prayer, to opening every week. Weddings and baptisms have been on hold for some time, but thankfully this restriction has been lifted even though there are still a limited number of guests

allowed at each ceremony. Five funerals have taken place during the past year with only 30 mourners allowed to attend.

Easter and harvest services were cancelled last year, but this year we were allowed to celebrate Easter Day together, which was lovely. Christmas Eve 2020 was celebrated with the service led by Rev. John Bird. Sadly the attendance was not very good with only eight people in the congregation.



On the 18 October 2020 the new war memorial stone at Ravenfield crossroads was dedicated by Rev. Peter Hughes, who conducted a short service with people watching, while observing social distancing. This was followed by the first ever outside service of Remembrance in November.

Throughout the year, Church members have held a quiz night on Friday evenings using Zoom, and other meetings have also been on Zoom. These have shown that "church" and fellowship can be done in different ways. Perhaps now, we should be starting to think outside the box regarding our services and hopefully grow our congregation.

The church family has supported the Maltby and Rotherham food banks throughout the pandemic and we intend to carry on with this in the future.

With the promise of life retuning to some normality in June, weddings and baptisms are now being booked and we hope that we can soon start singing again in our services. We all agree that we have missed praising the Lord in song.



Finally on behalf of the Parochial Church Council (PCC), I would like to thank everyone who helps keep our church open and such a welcoming place and thanks to Rev. Hughes for all his hard work.

# **News from Ravenfield Primary Academy**

2020-21 has been another unusual year at Ravenfield Primary Academy and thankfully has ended with all of the children back in school together. The support of our community of families, Maltby Learning Trust and friends of school has been more important than ever.

This was the first year for our nursery. It has been a real success story as it is an excellent teacher-led provision where the children get a really good start to life in school. It has been a real pleasure to welcome our first cohort of three year olds and watch as they settle in, make great progress and have fun in nursery. We welcome visitors

and enquiries for families interested in signing up for a place.



Back in September, we hoped the year would be less disrupted than in 2019-20. With a robust risk assessment we welcomed our children back and had a good autumn term albeit with many adaptations due to Covid-19. Assemblies took place on video, children had staggered starts to the beginning and the end of the

day and lunchtimes happened in the classroom. Children worked and had playtimes in their bubbles and got used to a

'new normal' in school. Christmas felt different as pupils took part in festivities in their class 'bubbles' including a nativity, Christmas songs and 12 Days of Christmas all captured on video.

The New Year brought fresh challenges with another lockdown as we adjusted to home learning again with only 'key worker' children in school. It was good to welcome everyone back to school in March.



This year we have made the most of curriculum opportunities that remote learning can bring. We have enjoyed virtual visits from a Roman soldier from Chester, a live link up with the Ashmolean Museum in Oxford (to learn all about the Egyptians), a video from a premiership football player and tried food from times gone by. In the summer term some Year 4 children worked with a professional filmmaker at Clifton Park Museum to make a video using facilities at the museum. In June/July artwork from our school was used in the 'Picture This' exhibition at Gulliver's Kingdom, Rotherham. All of the children were involved and the artwork produced (with Ravenfield as its subject) was fabulous.

For the Bears of Sheffield our children got the opportunity to design and paint a bear for the trail and raised £4,000 for Sheffield Children's Hospital. Our school was chosen to promote the trail on BBC Radio Sheffield, which was fun, and our bear can be found at the English Institute of Sport in Sheffield until the end of September.

#### Redrow Homes to build 303 dwelling Houses east of Moor lane South

As a result of the Rotherham Local Plan, the expected development on Moor Lane South has begun. Local residents received a letter dated 9th August 2021 advising them that a planning application for 303 dwellings had been submitted by Redrow Homes. They were invited to look at 57 documents on line relating to the development and send in comments within 21 days! The application was also in the Rotherham Advertiser of 13th August 2021.

Interestingly, all the documentation refers to Ravenfield. You may recall that RMBC declined to move the Parish Boundary and that officially the land is still in Bramley.

The Parish Council has asked to meet the Planning Department and the developers so that we can open up a sensible line of communication and raise our immediate concerns about the development and its construction. All the neighbours of this new development live in Ravenfield. We cannot prevent the development but hopefully we can minimize the disruption and the problems that such a large development is bound to cause.

Local councillors are elected by the community to decide how the council should carry out its activities. They represent public interest as well as individuals living within the ward in which they have been elected to serve a term of office.

They have regular contact with the general public through council meetings, telephone calls and regular surgeries. These are an opportunity for any ward resident to go and talk to their councillor face to face.

Councillors are not paid a salary for their work, but they do receive allowances. By law, all members of the council have to complete a declaration of interest form, the details of which are published each year.





### **Reports from Clubs and Societies**

#### Ravenfield Community Plan Group (RCPG) Charity 1188553

In 2018 Ravenfield Parish Council set itself the task of creating a new Community Plan. Fifteen residents, including three from the Parish Council (PC), carried out a survey of the residents with the objective of identifying the priorities with regards to local issues. This resulted in a new Community Plan being adopted by the Parish Council at the beginning of 2019.

The key objectives are

- to address the lack of facilities for teenagers
- to drain and develop the Jubilee Field, off Barberry Way/Kingsley Drive,
- to reduce speeding traffic
- to work on parking issues near the school and shops
- to prevent off road biker's nuisance
- to maintain a clean and tidy village.

It was identified that the PC would take the lead in the implementation of the plan, but there was a need to set up a separate action group to raise money to support the PC with these objectives. It was decided in April 2019 to apply for Charitable Status. Twelve months later thanks to much hard work by Jill Jesson and Kath Ward this was finally achieved on 16<sup>th</sup> March 2020.

A community gardening group has been established which meets up at the Crossroads on the first Wednesday of the month at 6.30pm.

Working in conjunction with the PC, a supply of British Legion large poppies will be purchased for display to honor the fallen. The Cavalier and Ravenfield Arms have kindly agreed to site British Legion collection boxes for donations.

The PC has been in discussion with Rotherham Borough Council to address the issue of Jubilee Field being flooded for much of the year. RMBC have identified a broken drain, which they have agreed will be repaired during this Financial Year (ending March 2022). Once this is rectified, the Parish Council will consider the installation of an all-weather perimeter path and a children's play area.

Ravenfield Community Gardening is a group of volunteers who meet on the first Wednesday of each month at 6.30pm to maintain and develop the flowerbeds at the crossroads. Our aim is to keeping it looking nice but also have flowers that will help our wildlife to survive.

Last October we planted a few bulbs – mainly daffodils and tulips. When they came up, they made a lovely show, but we all felt we hadn't planted enough, so this autumn we will be planting more. Please look out for the bulbs in the spring. We planted nine roses in remembrance of a local resident as well as lots of other plants that were kindly donated by members of our community. Thank you.

#### **Ravenfield Rubbish Rascals**


Individual members of this 20+ strong team have continued throughout the year to patrol their adopted

#### **Covid-19 Support Group**

The past 18 months have had a huge impact on us as individuals, as families and as a community. In March 2020 life as we knew it changed. Covid-19 caused a devastating direct and indirect loss to our lives, in many different ways.

The village community group rallied together to ensure that everyone in Ravenfield had a contact number if they needed support. We provided food parcels, not necessarily because our older residents needed food, but to let them know that as a community we were here, ready for any call for help. Donations came from many sources, all of which was gifted to residents in our village. We picked up prescriptions, posted letters, walked dogs, made calls to reduce loneliness and shopped for our most vulnerable. We did this together and we made a difference. Residents felt the togetherness in our community, people shouting out to say hello as they took walks, stopping and chatting.

So let's keep it going. Restrictions may be at an end, but our community spirit doesn't have to be.

#### **Ravenfield Art Group**

Our art group has kept going through most of the lockdown by using Zoom. Members with different skills have demonstrated them in this way and we have enjoyed sessions on using graphite pencils, acrylics, watercolours and even using a computer programme to create pictures and patterns. We had two sessions painting and

drawing outside, one in Ravenfield churchyard and the other at Conisbrough Castle. Both sessions were well attended.

Throughout lockdown, we have shared ideas, art galleries and video clips which we have found useful as there are many art techniques, which can be learned from YouTube videos. Before the current lockdown John Harrison demonstrated ways to use art notebooks and in March Gareth Watling showed us how to paint birds using acrylics. The group has recently started back in the Parish Hall with a demonstration in watercolours from Cath Dunn who specialises in abstract landscapes. Margaret Clarkson will be teaching us in September. This year there will be no art exhibition due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

#### **Bramley Townswomen Craft Group**


This group will resume meetings in Ravenfield Parish Hall on the second and fourth Thursday of each month starting Thursday August 12, 1.30-3.30.

Each of the activity areas are based on babies' development and links to the Early Years Framework (EYFS)




Classes are very relaxed: you can meet other parents and have a chat while babies play, explore and learn.

In 1750, William Wilson, licensee of the Angel Inn in the High Street Rotherham, is recorded as postmaster and publican, bookseller and stationer. He was also the only newsagent in town. In 1780, Mrs Sarah Wilson became postmistress on the death of her husband, and for nearly a hundred years the postmaster was a direct descendant of William Wilson.

For 86 of these years, a woman held the post. The Angel Inn was the town's post office until 1796. Rotherham's post mark is 655

This group suspended all activities after the second week of March 2020. The accounts of our Tote members were immediately frozen at that time.

At present, August 2021, we intend returning to normal service on Wednesday 1st of September, with a restart of the Tote weekly draw and a full *Coffee Morning*. Also we intend to start a *Breakfast Morning* every 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesday of each month. Full details to be announced. The next Committee Meeting is on 4th August when future plans will be made including Christmas activities. I started the fundraising off with a driveway sale on May 23<sup>rd</sup>. This had some great feedback with people


attending from neighbouring parishes as well as our village.
